The St. Catharines Public Library is hosting our online book club on Facebook.




Library patrons are invited to bring commercially packaged, unexpired and undamaged boxed or canned non-perishable food items to the Circulation Desk at any library location. Patrons can have up to \$50 waived in library fines per library account during this campaign.

How it works:

- 1 donated food item = up to \$5.00 fine waived, 2 donated food items = up to \$10.00 fine waived etc.
- Non-nutritional food items such as candy bars, soda and ramen will not be accepted.
- The Food for Fines promotion is only applicable towards existing fines. Credit cannot be given for future fines.
- Food collected will be donated to Community Care.
- This campaign does not apply to replacement costs for damaged or lost items, or collection agency fees.
