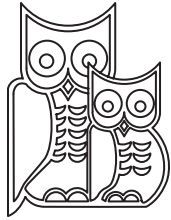

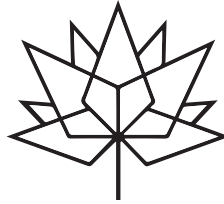

Dissent, Print Culture, and Anti-Confederation in James Barry's Diary

Nova Scotia elected three anti-Confederation governments in the ten years after 1867. Historians have posited several explanations for this, pointing to the words of economic and political elites of the day. Dr. Daniel Samson, Department of History, will examine the response of an ordinary Nova Scotian, miller James Barry, and argue that his opposition stemmed not from his economic position or his reformist politics, but from his radical-evangelical ideals; in other words, for James Barry, Confederation was a "Tory scheme".

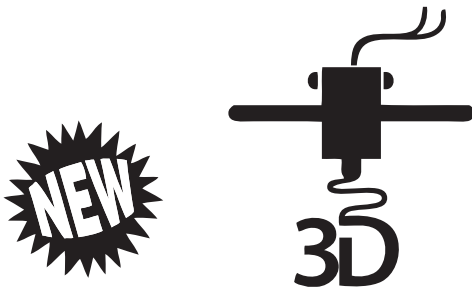

GREAT WAR CENTENARY SERIES

In recognition of the 100th anniversary of the First World War, the St. Catharines Public Library will continue to host a variety of exciting historical programs related to the conflict. Please join us for a series of fascinating talks as we commemorate the achievements and sacrifices of Canadians in the Great War.

Not Yet Diagnosed Nervous: The Effect of Class on Diagnosis and Treatment of Combat Trauma in Canadian Soldiers of WWI

Stephanie Dennie, Research Assistant and M.A., Classics, Brock University, will discuss the diagnosis and treatment of combat trauma for Canadian soldiers in WWI, with a focus on understanding the effects of class and rank. Mental casualties began in 1914, soon after the outbreak of war, and were not confined to Canadian or British soldiers. Both the dramatic effect of the Great War on the human mind and spirit, as well as the attempts of the medical community to coin, diagnose, and treat this rapidly growing but relatively unknown condition, will be explored.

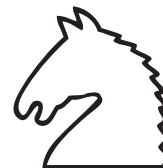

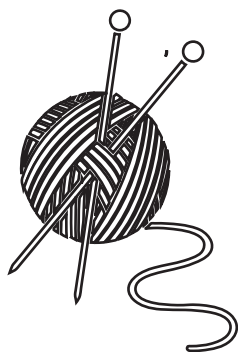

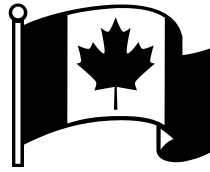
