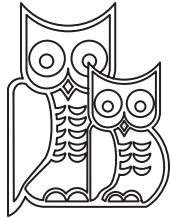

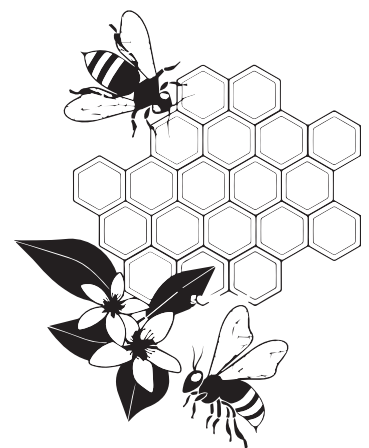
ST. CATHARINES PUBLIC LIBRARY STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

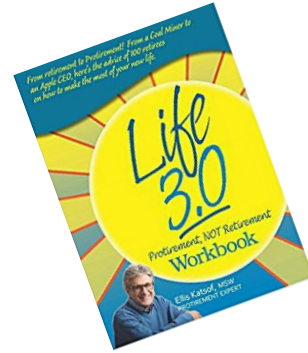

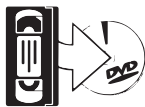

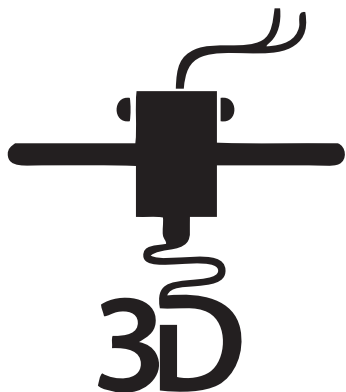
